	Subject	What are we learning this half term?
Maths	POWER	This term we will be deepening our knowledge of position and direction, using forwards, backwards, above and below. We will be using numbers to 100 and telling the time to the hour and half hour.
English	WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE STORY AND PICTURES BY MAURICE SENDAK	In English, we will be reading, Where the Wild Things are. This story will be used to inspire your child's writing and improve their grammar and transcription. Pupils will write their own narrative based on the story.
Curriculum	TASTE HEARING SIGHT SMELL TOUCH	In Science pupils will learn about the senses. In Art they will create their own piece of neoplasticism art or in D.T create a moving picture book. In computing pupils will be developing their programming skills and children will be continuing to develop skills in RE and PSHE.
