







## YEAR 4 CURRICULUM LETTER - MAPLE AND YEW –

|            | Subject   | What are we learning this half term?   |

| Maths      |    | This half term, we will be learning how to tell the time; working with 2D and 3D shapes and their angles; interpreting statistics; and developing our understanding of position and direction in geometry.   |
| English    |   | In English, we will be finishing 'Charlotte's Web' by E.B. White, and writing our own narratives based on the story. Then, we will be reading 'One Plastic Bag' by Miranda Paul. Throughout the reading of this text, we will be working towards writing an information text based on the book.  |
| Curriculum |  | <p>This term in Geography, we will be continuing to explore our 'Big Question', 'How is the United Kingdom divided on a map?'. To answer this question, we will be continuing to research the features of boundaries between cities and countries, before comparing them.</p> <p>In History we will be continuing to investigate our 'Big Question', 'Does the United States of America represent Native Americans?'. We will be using a variety of sources to explore different Native American tribes and their migration; considering how the States of America were divided, and the rights that Native Americans have in the present day.</p> |
| PE         |  | <b>Labelled</b> PE kit of black shorts and plain white T shirt and plimsolls will be required each week on a <b>Thursday</b> . These can stay in school for the half term. Ahead of PE days, jewellery must be removed, and long hair should be tied back in a ponytail.   |
