Helpful Information

UNIFORM:

Total Clothing now stock all embroidered items and need to be ordered online.

Whilst we encourage children to wear items with school logo we appreciate that this is not always a convenient option for busy families, so we advise when it is not possible that children come to school in a plain **purple sweatshirt or cardigan** (e.g.. Supermarket school wear £4 for 2 items) with a **white shirt** and **grey trousers**, **skirt or shorts or lilac school dress** (seasonal).

School shoes must be plain black school wear shoes. **NO trainers please.** These must be suitable for the season and weather



Earrings: One small metal studded earring per ear. For health and safety reasons we cannot permit other styles of earrings including hoop, or drop earrings. No other jewellery is permitted apart from appropriate wrist watches (to be decided at the discretion of the school) Make-up, including skin-art, nail varnish and false nails are not permitted. For health and safety reasons, finger nails should remain natural and kept short to avoid injuries during times such as PE. No extreme haircuts or colours are permitted (to be decided at the discretion of the school). No lines, patterns or shapes (including logos) are to be shaved/cut into hairstyles.

Jubilee promotes healthy choices

We are delighted to be continuing to start our day by providing children with a Bagel Breakfast.

Eating breakfast can help children do better in school, it improves memory and attention, which children need to learn.

Morning Snacks EYFS AND KS1 will continue to receive their FRUIT snack at break.

Break time snacks for Key Stage 2 pupils must be FRUIT or VEGATABLES ONLY PLEASE. Carrot Sticks, Raisins, Grapes, Berries, Apples, Bananas, Dried Fruit. (Please do not send snack bars as many are high in sugar)

We will be encouraging children and parents to move towards healthy choices in lunch boxes. Many examples of a balanced healthy lunch box can be found online.

Pupils should only bring water for drinking at school please.

Parking Signs on Highwood Avenue.



YELLOW ZIG-ZAG ROAD LINES are most often seen outside schools

It is illegal to park on yellow zig-zag lines anywhere.

Rule 243 of the Highway Code indicates a range of places where motorists must not park. It states that drivers must not park near a school entrance. *Parking outside a school specifically may obstruct visibility for parents and children trying to cross the road and is thus highly dangerous.*

When yellow zig-zags are accompanied by a sign indicating the hours of operation, it means that between those hours parking wardens or local authority civil enforcement officers have the power to issue motorists with penalty charges for parking in the area. (Please see the signs outside of our Highwood Avenue entrance). Parking on a yellow zig-zag without a sign or outside the indicated hours of operation doesn't mean that it's legal to do so; it just means that it's a matter for the police rather than the local authority to enforce.

We expect parents, carers and other visitors to:

- ✓ Respect the ethos, vision and values of our school
- ✓ Work together with staff in the best interests of our pupils
- ✓ Treat all members of the school community with respect setting a good example with speech and behaviour
- ✓ Seek a peaceful solution to all issues
- Correct their own child's behaviour (or those in their care), particularly in public, where it could lead to conflict, aggression or unsafe conduct
- ✓ Approach the right member of school staff respectfully to help resolve any issues of concern

Behaviour that will not be tolerated

- Disrupting, or threatening to disrupt, school operations (including events on the school grounds and sports team matches)
- Swearing, or using offensive language
- Displaying a temper, or inappropriate behaviours at members of staff, pupils or other parents in the presence of our pupils
- Threatening another member of the school community
- Sending abusive messages to our staff and/or pupils, including via text, email or social media
- Posting defamatory, offensive or derogatory comments about the school, its staff or any member of its community, on social media platforms
- Use of physical punishment against your child while on school premises
- Any aggressive behaviour (including verbally or in writing) towards another child or adult
- Disciplining another person's child please bring any behaviour incidents to a member of staff's attention
- Smoking or drinking alcohol on the school premises (unless alcohol has been allowed at a specific event)
- Possessing or taking drugs (including legal highs)
- Bringing dogs onto the school premises (other than guide dogs)

Breaching expected conduct could result in:

- A warning letter to the parent
- Invite to meet with a senior member of staff
- Contact the appropriate authorities (for example the police and Local Authority Agencies)
- Advice from the trust's legal team regarding further action (in cases of conduct that may be libellous or slanderous)
- Ban the parent from the school site



Jubilee L.E.A.D. Academy will always respond to an incident in a proportional way.

The final decision for how to respond to breaches of the expected conduct rests with the Head of School.
