**THANK YOU SO MUCH** to the families who have been working hard to ensure children's punctuality and attendance is high. THANK YOU for getting these important habits established early on in your child's life as it will make a big difference in their futures.

Please ensure any absences are reported to Mrs O'Connor. Failure to report an absence will result in a home visit being made.

School attendance is important because the law requires it. As a parent you are legally responsible for making sure your child gets a full time education. This means registering your child at school and making sure they attend regularly.



The table below shows the number of days absence over the full academic year

<b>100%</b>	0 days Missed
<b>95%</b>	9 days of Absence. 1 week and 4 days of learning missed
<b>90%</b>	19 days of Absence. 3 weeks and 4 days of learning missed
<b>85%</b>	28 days of Absence. 5 weeks and 3 days of learning missed
<b>80%</b>	38 days of Absence. 7 weeks and 3 days of learning missed
<b>75%</b>	46 days of Absence. 9 weeks and 1 day of learning missed
