Mobile Phones in School - Reminder

The DfE make it clear that *"All schools should be mobile phone-free environments by default."* As such, no pupil is allowed a mobile phone with them in school during the school day. In following this guidance, we also want to support families by providing the opportunity for storage during the school day. This is because we know some parents/carers would like older pupils to have phones with them on their way to and from school for safety reasons. We know it is already used successfully by many.

For safeguarding reasons, pupils are not permitted to have mobile phones or smartwatches in school. If a parent or carer wishes their child to bring a phone, they must inform the school office in advance, preferably by email to our admin address.

All devices must be switched off and handed into the office via the classroom phone bag, then collected at the end of the day.

Please note that any phones, tablets, or electronic devices brought onto school premises are done so entirely at the owner's risk; the school cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage.
