ATTENDANCE MATTERS



At Jubilee L.E.A.D. Academy attendance is a high priority. There is a clear link between good attendance and good attainment and the opposite is true, poor attendance can lead to poor attainment. Attendance is also linked to Safeguarding, if your child is not in school then we need to check that they are safe and well. If your child is not attending school regularly it can be perceived as academic neglect.



If possible please arrange medical appointments outside of school hours or during the school holidays. If your child needs to leave early for an important medical appointment siblings will need to be collected by someone else or booked into after school club as we cannot allow all children to leave early for 1 child's medical appointment.

If appointments cannot be arranged outside of school hours please ensure your child is in school before/after the appointment along with medical evidence.

Fines

These fines are per parent, per child and are **not** paid to the school -

First Offence – The first time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child, paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent, per child, if paid within 21 days

Second Offence (within 3 rolling years) – The second time a Penalty Notice is issued the amount will be:

£160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 rolling years) – The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court.

I have referred 27 families so far this academic year for penalty notices due to poor attendance and holidays!

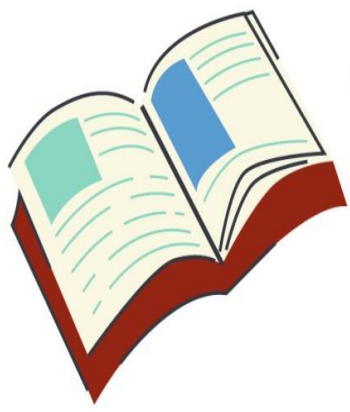


There are 75 pupils who have between 98-99% attendance, if they remain above 98% at the end of the summer term they will also take part in the fun day in school.
