Dear Parent/Carer

At Jubilee our first and foremost priority is to keep your child safe and healthy. Our theme this half term is:

## Sexual harassment

When referring to sexual harassment we mean 'unwanted conduct of a sexual nature' that can occur online and offline and both inside and outside of school.

Sexual harassment can occur between two children of any age and gender, including primary schools. It can occur through a group of children sexually assaulting or harassing a single child or group of children. Sexual violence and harassment exist on a continuum and is NEVER acceptable.

Sexual harassment is likely to violate a child's dignity, make them feel intimidated, degraded and humiliated.

### Sexual Harassment can include

- Sexual comments
  - Sexual jokes
- Physical behaviour
- Online sexual harassment



### The Law

The law is there to protect the victim, which means Sexual Harassment is illegal.

#### The law says:

A child under the age of 13 can never consent to any sexual activity.

The age of consent is 16.

Creating and sharing photos and videos of under 18's is illegal. This is called Sexting. It also includes children sharing and making images and videos of themselves.

Sexual harassment creates a culture that, if not challenged can normalise inappropriate behaviours and provide an environment that may lead to sexual violence.

### What can we do to keep our children safe?

To keep our children safe we need to continue to:

- Encourage our children to be open and honest about their experiences so they can feel safe.
- As parents, have conversations with our children that are appropriate to their development stage.
- We all need to model our behaviour to show respect between the genders, so the children can see how to behave.
- Treat children with respect and dignity.
- Challenge people who undermine the safety of children.

# S.E.N.D



As a staff team we strive to achieve the highest standards in order to support pupils with special educational needs and disabilities. (S.E.N.D) We promote an inclusive educational environment in which we support and encourage all pupils to reach their potential. Here, are some examples of the adjustments we provide to support pupils with S.E.N.D. in and around our school environment.

Pupils are supported in a variety of ways in our classrooms. A vast array of reasonable adjustments are used to allow pupils to access the learning. These range from talking tins and pencil grips to ear defenders, timers and iPads. We also make use of wobble cushions and Cherry class has its very own sensory area.

Our teachers will differentiate work to enable all pupils to engage in a rich curriculum to ensure they reach their potential!

Pupils may receive interventions while they are in school to support their academic, social and emotional development.

Interventions on offer include precision teaching, Lexia, the learning village and emotional literacy support assistant.
